These finds are evidence of Roman activity.

There are many types of Roman pottery, tile & brick. Here are a few ...

Roman Brick and mortar.

This is still in situ in the Jewry Wall, Leicester



The bricks are 300mm long.

Roman Grey Ware. Everyday pottery.



Grey Ware sherds from Leicestershire fields. The storage vessel was found in a pit in the gateway of Leicester Castle yard.

Roman Tile



Roman Tile found in Leicestershire fields. Sometimes it had a grey core.

White Ware. Roman flagon base found in a Leicestershire field.



This flagon, in the British Museum, has the same base. It was made in Verulamium between c.AD50-100. This form was generally made up to c.AD200.



Samian Ware. High quality Gaulish tableware.

Sometimes it is decorated. These sherds were found in Leicester.



Samian Ware bowl found in Leicester and made in Gaul between AD140-150.
